

Canadian Fair Trade Network – March 30th, 2015 – Board Decision

On 2015-03-30 10:48 AM pacific time, Sean McHugh wrote to all board members, except Zack, Kyra and Dustin:

Hello again CFTN Board Members

I hope you have all been well!

Zack, Kyra and Dustin have been left off this email, as it has to do with deciding on the location of our next national conference, and the three of them are involved with the Winnipeg and Halifax bids.

I would like to go ahead and make this decision as soon as possible, as both cities are awaiting a response from me.

In the end, we received two bids, one from Winnipeg and one from Halifax. However, with that said, the Winnipeg bid is 38 pages long and comes with considerable commitment, including money, while the Halifax bid was a one page email; both are attached for review.

I therefore believe that Winnipeg should be named the next host city!

Please send a quick note back to me on this today, and if you feel that further discussion is needed, or you have comments or questions about the process, the bid and the decision, please do share your thoughts!

I would like to communicate this back to the organizing team and out through our newsletter as soon as possible, so a prompt reply would be welcomed :)
